### Our English strategic priorities are that:

- 1. GCSE English Language and Literature to have grades at 9-7 in line with FFT20, and at 9-5 in line with FF5.
- 2. At GCSE, to ensure basics start to match and that class teachers know where students are currently in both English and Maths.
- 3. To close the gap for vulnerable learners including students who are pupil premium and SEND.
- 4. To develop and embed a literacy scheme to catch up Year 7 and Year 8 students.
- 5. To secure good teaching, which challenges students, as a minimum for all in KS3, 4 and 5.
- 6. Home learning to be of high quality, set every week as a minimum for all students in KS3, 4 and 5.
- 7. Collaboratively plan together as a department, sharing best practice, resources and strategies.
- 8. Students should have opportunities to take part in enrichment activities to foster their love for English.
